Our 2,000 online missionaries reach across the world daily to meet the needs of people who are in crisis and are desperate for God.”

Christians with a heart to [volunteer](#) have the opportunity to share their faith from their personal computer with those seeking Jesus. As an Online Missionary, Christians can now have their own personal ministry answering e-mail questions they receive from faith-seekers around the world. Volunteers engage with individuals, providing spiritual guidance, discipleship and prayer. Through www.GMOJoinUs.com, Christians can learn more about becoming an online missionary and apply.
